## Summary of key findings for parents

**This provision meets requirements**

- The childminder demonstrates a secure knowledge of how to safeguard children and the procedures to follow should she have concerns about a child.
- The childminder has a good understanding of the learning and development requirements. She clearly explains how she uses observation and assessment to plan activities that meet children's individual learning needs.
- The childminder acknowledges the importance of keeping her knowledge up to date, to ensure she is informed of any changes in legislation.
- The childminder recognises the importance of sharing information with parents and other professionals involved in children's development, to support their learning and care needs.
- The childminder knows the importance of evaluating her practice. She acknowledges the advantage of involving others, such as parents, children and other professionals, to help identify areas for improvement.
- The childminder demonstrates a clear knowledge of positive strategies for behaviour management.
- The childminder shows a clear understanding of her role and responsibility in ensuring she regularly supervises her assistants, to help develop their teaching.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

## **Inspection activities**

- The inspector viewed the areas of the home used by children.
- The inspector viewed relevant documentation, including evidence of paediatric first-aid training and public liability insurance.
- The inspector asked the childminder questions throughout the inspection to establish her understanding of how to safeguard children, and how she would monitor their learning and development.
- The inspector and the childminder discussed how she would plan for children's play activities and learning.
- The inspector discussed the self-evaluation process with the childminder.
