Summary of key findings for parents

This provision meets requirements

- The childminder knows how to promote children's welfare. She understands the signs and symptoms which may indicate a child's welfare is at risk and knows how to respond if she has concerns.
- The childminder knows how she will promote positive behaviour. For example, she will teach children to be kind and respectful to others.
- The childminder understands how to promote children's learning, including how to monitor their development and plan activities to support their individual needs.
- The childminder recognises the importance of reflecting on her practice. For example, she has accessed webinars and built positive relationships with the local authority early years team to focus on areas for improvement.
- The childminder understands how to support healthy lifestyles and promote good hygiene practices through, for instance, daily routines and regular opportunities for children to be physically active.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- The inspector had a tour of parts of the premises used for childminding.
- The inspector discussed with the childminder her understanding of requirements and how she will support children's learning and care.
- The inspector viewed relevant documentation, including the childminder's public liability insurance and paediatric first-aid qualification.
- The inspector checked evidence of the suitability of the childminder and adults living on the premises. She discussed the childminder's understanding of self-evaluation.
