Summary of key findings for parents

This provision meets requirements

- The manager and staff understand their role in safeguarding and protecting children within their care. They are aware of signs and symptoms that may cause them concerns about the welfare of children and know the reporting procedures.
- The manager knows how to monitor staff performance and to use the self-evaluation process. The manager understands how this will help to improve the provision and children's overall experiences.
- The manager knows how to organise the deployment of staff to ensure a good level of supervision and one-to-one support for individual children as required.
- The manager has effective systems in place to support staff professional development. Staff are given many opportunities to develop their learning further.
- The manager understands the importance of having strong partnerships with parents. Parents share detailed information when their children first start at the setting.
- The manager has a clear understanding of how children learn and develop, as well as how to support children with special educational needs. She knows how to cater for the individual needs and interests of the children.
- The manager knows how to meet the emotional needs of children of all ages. She understands the importance of providing a safe, secure and friendly environment for children to play and explore in.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- The inspector discussed with the manager how she supports the individual needs of the children.
- The inspector toured the areas of the premises the manager plans to use for the club and looked at the resources she intends to use.
- The inspector viewed a range of documents, including staff suitability.

Tinies Holiday Club Caxton House is one of several run by Tinies UK Ltd. It registered in 2009 and operates from one ground floor conference room in the Department of Work & Pensions, within the London Borough of Westminster. The setting opens five days a week during the half term and Easter and summer holidays. Operational hours are between 8.30am and 6pm. The setting employs a team of three staff. Of these, two hold appropriate qualifications at level 6 and one holds a qualification at level 4.

This inspection was carried out by Ofsted under sections 49 and 50 of the Childcare Act 2006 on the quality and standards of provision that is registered on the Early Years Register. The registered person must ensure that this provision complies with the statutory framework for children's learning, development and care, known as the early years foundation stage.

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
