

## **Compliance action taken for childcare provision**

### **Summary of outcome**

All early years providers must meet the legal requirements in the 'Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage', which you can find at [www.gov.uk/government/publications/early-years-foundation-stage-framework--2](http://www.gov.uk/government/publications/early-years-foundation-stage-framework--2). If we find that a provider is not meeting the requirements, we can take action to ensure they put matters right.

On 10, 12, 15 and 18 July 2019, we received concerns that this provider was not meeting some of these requirements. We visited the provider to discuss the concerns and as a result, we have issued a Welfare Requirements Notice. This is a legal notice that requires the provider to take the actions below within the timescales set out;

ensure that all staff understand safeguarding policy and procedures and have up-to-date knowledge of safeguarding issues so that they know what to do in the event of a concern about a child's welfare

ensure that staff are supported effectively so that they are clear about their role and responsibilities

ensure that details of any accidents are recorded accurately

undertake risk assessments to ensure that children and staff are not exposed to extreme temperatures

ensure that there are suitable facilities for the hygienic preparation of food for children and that staff involved in handling and preparing food have received training in food hygiene by 13 August 2019.

The provider will be able to give parents further information about this. The provider is still registered with Ofsted.

### **Publication of compliance action**

We aim to ensure that the welfare of children and young people is protected in the services we regulate. The Childcare Act 2006 and accompanying regulations set out our responsibilities to regulate childminders and childcare providers. This includes the enforcement powers we have in relation to those registered providers who do not comply

with the requirements for registration.

We publish details of any actions we take, or the childminder or childcare provider takes to bring about compliance with requirements on our website for a period of five years commencing on the date we complete our investigation.
