This provision does not meet requirements

- The childminder has failed to maintain public liability insurance. Furthermore, she has not informed Ofsted of her change of address.
- The childminder demonstrates, through discussion, an appropriate understanding of how to use observations and assessments to measure the progress of children's learning.
- The childminder plans to use a variety of ways to communicate with parents to keep them informed about their children's achievements.
- The childminder shows an understanding of how to promote children's health. She will provide healthy snacks and meals for children. The childminder will offer children daily opportunities for fresh air and exercise.
- The childminder shows an awareness of how to promote positive behaviour. She plans to praise children for their achievements.
- The childminder demonstrates a suitable understanding of the signs and symptoms of child abuse. She knows where to report any concerns she has about children's safety and welfare.
- The childminder plans to work in partnership with other early years settings that children attend. She will share information with them about children's learning and development.
- The childminder is aware of her responsibility to complete a written summary to show children's progress when they are between the ages of two and three years. Through discussions, she explains how she will share this with parents and health professionals.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

The childminder registered in 2003 and lives in Mablethorpe. She operates all year round from 8am until 6pm, Monday to Friday, except for bank holidays and family holidays. The childminder holds an appropriate qualification at level 3.
