Summary of key findings for parents

This provision meets requirements

- The childminder has a secure understanding of her responsibility to keep children safe. She knows the correct procedures to follow in the event she has a safeguarding concern about a child in her care.
- The childminder explains how she would make regular assessments of children's learning. She describes how she would plan appropriate next steps to promote their development. The childminder explains how she would monitor children's progress and share this with parents.
- The childminder describes appropriate ways to support children's behaviour and foster their independence. She explains the importance of promoting children's self-belief and their respect for others.
- The childminder understands the benefit of working in partnership with parents and other professionals to help support children's learning and well-being.
- The childminder explains appropriate admission procedures. She describes how she would respect children's home routines to help them to settle in her care.
- The childminder explains how she would provide healthy meals and daily outdoor exercise to help support children's awareness of healthy lifestyles.
- The childminder reflects on her practice and understands the importance of enhancing her skills and knowledge. She has attended training since her last inspection. This helps to support her professional development.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- The inspector had a tour of the areas of the premises used for childminding.
- The inspector held discussions with the childminder.
- The inspector viewed a sample of documents, including records that the childminder would use when caring for children.
- The inspector considered evidence of suitability checks carried out for all adults living or working in the household.
