Overall outcome

The school does not meet the independent school standards relevant to the material change. The material change has already been implemented

Main inspection findings

Part 3. Welfare, health and safety of pupils

Paragraphs 7, 11, 12, 14 and 16

- The school's child protection policy reflects the latest guidance issued by the Secretary of State. The school does not have a website; the policy is readily available in hard copy to parents and carers. The designated safeguarding leader was unavailable to meet the inspector, and the deputy designated safeguarding leader did not realise that his most recent enhanced safeguarding training from January 2017 had lapsed. The single central record of vetting checks on adults working with pupils is not compliant, as outlined on part 4. Information to evidence leaders' actions in managing concerns, referrals and actions taken was unavailable. Leaders spoken to did not have a sharp understanding of how to keep pupils as safe from harm as possible, especially in terms of the latest statutory guidance.
- The school's updated health and safety policy is suitable. However, there is no written risk assessment policy, the written risk assessment for the premises is inadequate and there are no suitable written risk assessments for use of the nearby park and leisure centre facilities. There was not enough available evidence to confirm that the school is likely to comply with the Regulatory Reform (Fire Safety) Order 2005.
- There is likely to be an appropriate deployment of staff to ensure that pupils are safely supervised.
- Some of the independent school standards checked in this part are not met, as listed in the annex to this report.

Part 4. Suitability of staff, supply staff, and proprietors

All paragraphs

■ The single central record of checks on those working with pupils is not compliant. At the start of the inspection, a staff member's enhanced Disclosure and Barring Service (DBS) check was marked as 'not applicable'. Prohibition from teaching checks had only been completed on those staff members with qualified teacher status, and barred



- list checks, though carried out as part of enhanced DBS checks, were all marked as 'not applicable'. Work to remedy these failings began during the inspection.
- Some of the independent school standards checked in this part are not met, as listed in the annex to this report.

Part 5. Premises of and accommodation at schools

All paragraphs

- The school has already relocated to their premises at Ujima House, 388 Wembley High Road, London HA9 6AR. The proprietors intend to use only these premises from September 2019, and then some additional premises at 45 Denmark Road, Kilburn NW6 5BP from later in the autumn term. These were not visited during this inspection.
- The Ujima House premises are clean, secure and generally well maintained. There is comfortably room for up to 40 pupils of secondary age.
- The building includes five classrooms, one pupil toilet (the other is still being completed) and washing facility, separate staff toilets, an open-plan kitchen and an office.
- There is no outdoor space. Pupils go outside to a local park for daily recreation. They attend one of three leisure centres for physical education, all of which provide pupils with access to changing and shower facilities.
- The acoustic conditions, sound insulation and internal and external lighting are suitable throughout the premises.
- Suitably labelled drinking water is available throughout the school day from the kitchen. The temperature of hot water supplies is safely regulated.
- There is no medical room facility.
- Some of the independent school standards checked in this part are not met, as listed in the annex to this report.

Part 8. Quality of leadership in and management of schools

Paragraph 34

■ The change of the school's main premises has already taken place, and this inspection has identified unmet independent school standards. Additionally, leaders have not ensured that all the standards checked during this inspection — including the standard in this part — are likely to be met if the requested material change to increase the number on roll to 20 is implemented.



Compliance with regulatory requirements

The school does not meet the requirements of the schedule to The Education (Independent School Standards) Regulations 2014 ('the independent school standards') and associated requirements that are relevant to the material change, as set out in the annex of this report.

Information about this school

- New Level Academy is a small independent school and alternative provider for pupils in the London Borough of Brent.
- The school provides permanent school placements and temporary alternative



provision for boys and girls with a range of complex needs, especially social, emotional and mental health needs. The school works with pupils excluded from, or at risk of exclusion from, schools in the vicinity. Most pupils are dual-registered. Some pupils have education, health and care plans.

- The school makes no use of alternative provision. However, pupils attend physical education sessions at three local leisure centres: Bridge Park Complex, Stonebridge, Harrow NW10 0RG; Vale Farm Sports Centre, Watford Road, Wembley HA0 3HG; and Willesden Sports Centre, Donnington Road, London NW10 3QX.
- Leaders have decided not to pursue their original application to extend their age range from 13 to 19 to 11 to 19. This inspection therefore did not consider this change.
- In the future, the school also intends to make use of additional premises at 45 Denmark Road, Kilburn NW6 5BP.



Information about this inspection

- The inspection was commissioned by the Department for Education (DfE) to consider the school's application to make three material changes to its registration agreement. The proposed changes were in its main premises, an increase in the maximum number of pupils from 16 to 20, and to extend the age range to 11 to 19. However, the chair of the proprietorial body asked the inspector during the inspection not to consider a change in age range.
- The inspection was announced earlier than usual, because of its timing in the school holidays. The proprietors were informed of the inspection on 14 August 2019.
- The DfE requested that the inspector consider whether particular independent school standards contained within Parts 1, 2, 3, 4, 5 and 8 are likely to be met if the material changes are implemented. In light of the intention to consider only the change in premises and increase in number, the inspector checked those requirements within Parts 3, 4, 5 and 8 only.
- The inspector met with the chair of the proprietorial body, who is also the headteacher. He toured the school's premises, checked the single central record of vetting checks, and considered a range of documentation in relation to safeguarding, health and safety and risk assessment.
- There were not enough recent responses to Ofsted's online survey (Parent View) to consider as part of this inspection.
