Summary of key findings for parents

This provision meets requirements

- The childminder understands how to keep children safe and report any safeguarding concerns she may have about a child's welfare.
- The childminder recognises the importance of working in partnership with parents for continuity of care and learning. She knows how to use her professional development to work collaboratively with external agencies to support children with special educational needs.
- The childminder has a secure knowledge and understanding of the learning and development requirements. She discusses how she intends to use her observations and assessments of children to plan activities that build on what they know.
- The childminder understands the importance of supporting children's emotional and physical well-being. She plans to teach children how to lead healthy lifestyles, such as through healthy eating and regular opportunities to access the outdoors.
- The childminder identifies how to promote positive behaviour, including how to help children learn to value difference and develop respect for others.
- The childminder has an action plan in place to help her to continually improve.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

- The inspector looked at the childminder's policies and procedures, including safeguarding and complaints procedures.
- The inspector discussed with the childminder how she plans to share information with parents and other relevant professionals about children's care, learning and development.
- The inspector discussed with the childminder how she intends to assess children's abilities and plan for their individual needs and ongoing progress.
- The inspector discussed with the childminder the range of indoor and outdoor resources and various activities she plans to provide.
- The inspector discussed the childminder's plans to continually improve.
