Summary of key findings

This provision meets requirements

- The childminder has a secure understanding of how children learn and develop. She has carefully considered the learning environment, indoors and outdoors, to enable children to independently make choices about their play.
- The childminder understands how to promote children's personal development. She explains how she teaches children about road safety and staying safe when using the internet, and she provides healthy home-cooked meals and snacks.
- The childminder demonstrates that she understands how to positively manage children's behaviour. She clearly explains how she will support children to build relationships, consider the needs of others, share resources and take turns.
- The childminder uses photographs to evidence how she equips children with skills to support their learning. For example, children can be seen learning how to plant seeds and engaging in physical exercise.
- The childminder gathers the views of children through written feedback and video messages. Older children say how happy and secure they feel in the childminder's care. They report that they enjoy a wide variety of activities that cover the seven areas of learning.
- The childminder is confident in discussing safeguarding procedures. She demonstrates clear knowledge about child protection issues and how to keep children safe. She knows who to contact if she has any concerns about a child's welfare.
- The childminder ably demonstrates how she will reduce risks and hazards to children in her home and while on outings. She has thorough risk assessments in place and implements daily health and safety checks when caring for children.
- The childminder understands the significance of partnership working. Through discussion, she explains the importance of sharing information with parents, carers and other providers to support children's learning and development.
- The childminder is reflective and identifies ways to continually improve her provision, including evaluating her practice and attending training courses.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities
