

Compliance action taken for childcare provision

Summary of outcome

All early years providers must meet the legal requirements in the 'Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage', which you can find at

www.gov.uk/government/publications/early-years-foundation-stage-framework--2. If we find that a provider is not meeting the requirements, we can take action to ensure they put matters right. On 19 August 2019, we carried out an inspection which judged the provider to be inadequate with enforcement action. We issued a Welfare Requirements Notice which is a legal notice that requires the provider to take action within the timescales set out. You can read the report and see the actions raised on our website.

On 17 September 2019, we carried out a monitoring visit to assess what action the provider has taken and ensure the welfare requirements notice has been met. It is an offence not to comply with an enforcement notice. The inspector found that the provider has taken sufficient action to meet the requirements.

We carried out observations of the premises, spoke with staff and the provider and reviewed relevant documentation. The provider has completed an action plan and is working with the local authority on what needs to be improved to continue to meet requirements. All staff are suitably vetted, and the provider has implemented robust systems for recruitment and selection. The provider has appropriate systems in place to complete supervision meetings and identify staff training needs. An effective key person is in place for each child to ensure their needs are met. The provider has effective arrangements to monitor, support and coach staff to improve the quality of teaching and learning overall. The arrangements for observation, assessment and monitoring children's progress is under review and we acknowledge that this would take some time to be established.

We are satisfied that the provider has taken appropriate action to address the actions and the next step is a full inspection where any outstanding action will also be monitored.

The provider remains suitable for registration with Ofsted.
