## Summary of key findings

### This provision meets requirements

- The childminder recognises the importance of developing her skills and keeping up to date with new guidelines and requirements. For example, she has attended training and keeps her safeguarding knowledge current.
- The childminder describes how she will show children how to keep safe and be aware of their own personal safety. For instance, she plans to demonstrate how to cross a road safely using role-play equipment and small-world resources.
- The childminder has a good understanding of how children develop. She intends to communicate with parents to establish children's starting points and plan activities to motivate and interest them.
- Since the previous inspection, the childminder has improved her knowledge of how children learn. She now gives them more time to answer questions, before providing answers herself. She has also improved the way she manages and promotes good behaviour. For example, she intends to talk to older children to explain any issues to them and encourage them to be able to understand their emotions and that actions have consequences.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
