Summary of key findings

This provision meets requirements

- The provider is ambitious and seeks to provide an inclusive setting. She takes appropriate action to ensure that all staff access relevant training to support their understanding of how to meet children's individual care needs.
- The provider demonstrates a clear understanding of how to develop positive relationships with children. She has settling-in arrangements which are flexible and support children's emotional well-being.
- The provider plans to gather key information about a child's interests and care needs before they first start at the setting. She plans to use this information in order to help plan activities, play equipment and care routines.
- The provider understands the importance of developing effective relationships with parents. She has systems in place to exchange information with parents, to help promote continuity in children's care.
- There are procedures in place to evaluate the quality of the setting and the service provided. The provider plans to seek feedback from parents and children through questionnaires and ongoing discussions. The provider plans to use the information she receives to identify any areas to improve.
- The provider has effective procedures in place to safeguard children. She has a secure knowledge of child protection procedures and recognises the signs and symptoms of abuse. Staff complete regular safeguarding training to help them keep up to date with current child protection issues which may affect a child.
- Risk assessments are clear. They take account of potential hazards in the environment and identify ways to help minimise these. This helps to ensure children's safety and well-being.
- All staff hold valid paediatric first-aid qualifications. The provider demonstrates she understands how to respond appropriately in an emergency.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
