Summary of key findings

This provision meets requirements

- Leaders understand their duty to keep children safe and can recognise the indicators that may cause them concern about the welfare of a child in their care. They know how to refer any concerns they may have. Leaders understand how to recognise if a child is at risk of being exposed to extreme ideas or behaviours.
- Leaders provide a suitable environment for children who attend the club. They carefully consider how to provide activities and resources that build on children's interests and help them to develop new skills.
- The premises are clean and safe. Leaders know how to create strategies to encourage children to build on their confidence and independently carry out acts of self-care. They understand how to support good hygiene routines and emphasise the health and well-being of children.
- Leaders have carefully considered how they evaluate the provision to maintain continuous improvement. They understand how to involve parents and children, for example, in developing new ideas for activities and trips.
- Leaders know how to support children in managing their feelings and behaviour. They have considered how to create activities which develop children's social skills and understand how to create an inclusive environment.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

The Holiday Fun Club playscheme registered in 2008. It operates from the John Loughborough School in Tottenham in the London Borough of Haringey. The club operates from 10am to 4pm Monday to Thursday and from 10am to 2pm on Friday, for four weeks of the year. There are four members of staff. Of these, two hold relevant early years qualifications at levels 3 and 4 and one holds qualified teacher status.
