## **Summary of key findings**

#### This provision does not meet requirements

- The childminder knows how to complete risk assessments of her home to identify risks to children. However, she needs to take further actions to ensure the outdoor play area, resources and equipment are suitable for children to use. For example, the childminder has a large amount of waste boxes in the garden and the outdoor resources and equipment are not clean.
- The childminder is not aware that she needs to keep records of attendance for all children. As a result, she does not record the attendance for children over five years old. This is a breach of the childcare register requirements.
- The childminder has knowledge of child protection issues and wider safeguarding issues. She is familiar with the procedures to report any concerns and allegations to the relevant authorities.
- The childminder knows how to provide a range of opportunities for children to explore and to make progress with their development. She knows how to plan activities to support children's development across all areas of learning.
- The childminder understands how to evaluate her practice in order to help identify areas for improvement and her own professional development needs.
- The childminder knows how to work with parents to help children settle in her care. She describes a range of opportunities that she intends to provide for children to develop their independence, confidence and physical skills.
- The childminder knows how to develop relationships with parents in order to share information to support children's learning and development. She understands the importance of working with parents to support children to develop positive behaviour and to learn right from wrong.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
