## **Summary of key findings**

#### This provision meets requirements

- The childminder has a secure knowledge of how to safeguard children. She knows how to recognise the signs and symptoms of abuse and neglect, and if a child is at risk of being exposed to extreme views or actions. The childminder is familiar with the procedures to report any concerns and allegations to the relevant authorities.
- The childminder understands how to observe and assess children's learning. She knows how to plan a range of opportunities across the different areas of learning to help children make progress in their development.
- The childminder recognises the importance of working with parents to help identify children's starting points, to share information about children's development and to extend children's learning at home.
- The childminder knows how to support children's personal development, in particular their independence, confidence and perseverance. She knows how to support them to settle and to develop their emotional well-being.
- The childminder describes how she intends to promote positive behaviour to help teach children right from wrong. She understands the importance of teaching them how to manage their feelings and about how their actions have consequences.
- The childminder understands how to evaluate her practice to identify ways to improve children's experiences. She knows how to access professional development opportunities to help enhance her knowledge and skills.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
