

Compliance action taken for childcare provision

Summary of outcome

All early years providers must meet the legal requirements in the 'Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage', which you can find at www.gov.uk/government/publications/early-years-foundation-stage-framework--2. If we find that a provider is not meeting the requirements, we can take action to ensure they put matters right. On 11 September 2019 we visited the setting following a notification by the provider of an incident. During the visit we found that the provider was not meeting the requirements in relation to the safety of the premises. We have issued a Welfare Requirements Notice asking the provider to; implement effective steps to prevent unauthorised persons entering the premises. The provider remains registered with Ofsted.

We visited the setting on 8 October 2019 to monitor the Welfare Requirements Notice. We found that the provider has completed thorough risk assessment and implemented procedures to ensure the premises are safe and secure for children. Therefore, no further action is required and the provider remains suitable for registration.

Publication of compliance action

We aim to ensure that the welfare of children and young people is protected in the services we regulate. The Childcare Act 2006 and accompanying regulations set out our responsibilities to regulate childminders and childcare providers. This includes the enforcement powers we have in relation to those registered providers who do not comply with the requirements for registration.

We publish details of any actions we take, or the childminder or childcare provider takes to bring about compliance with requirements on our website for a period of five years commencing on the date we complete our investigation.
