Summary of key findings

This provision meets requirements

- The childminder knows how to plan activities that help children remain interested and motivated to learn. For example, she pays attention to the way children learn and develop and how they can achieve. This helps her use different strategies to enhance children's learning and to follow their interests.
- The childminder understands how to provide more activities and resources to help children use their creativity and imagination in their play.
- The childminder knows how to help children adopt a healthy lifestyle. For example, she helps children access nutritious food and talks to them about the importance of washing their hands to reduce the risk of infection.
- The childminder is clear about safeguarding practice and the reporting procedures to follow if she has any welfare concerns about a child or an adult.
- The childminder undertakes checks on her home and resources to keep children safe and secure. Through outings, children practise to cross the roads safely and become familiar with the local community.
- The childminder knows how to work in partnerships with parents. For example, she keeps parents regularly informed about their children's academic progress and well-being, and helps them support children's learning at home.
- The childminder knows how to form links with other providers to support children's learning and development.
- The childminder attends courses to widen her childminding skills and is confident to approach outside professionals for support and guidance.
- The childminder seeks the views and comments of parents and others to further improve her practice.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
