## Summary of key findings

#### This provision does not meet requirements

- The childminder has not provided Ofsted with the necessary information to ensure that all the required suitability checks for household members over the age of 16 years are completed.
- The childminder is unable to provide evidence of her first-aid training. She does not have this documentation available to show that she is meeting all the required regulations.
- The childminder demonstrates her knowledge and understanding of the learning and development requirements. She explains how she will deliver a broad curriculum and use her observations of children to identify what they need to learn next.
- The childminder recognises the importance of working in partnership with parents and other professional agencies to ensure consistency in children's care and learning.
- The childminder explains how she will provide healthy home-cooked meals and how she will promote children's well-being by providing plenty of opportunity for fresh air and exercise.
- The childminder has completed safeguarding training and has a secure understanding of how to recognise signs and symptoms of abuse. She knows who to contact should she have any concerns regarding children's welfare.
- The childminder knows the procedures to follow if allegations are made against herself or a family member.
- The childminder discusses how she uses risk assessment to identify any potential hazards to children. She demonstrates a clear understanding of how to reduce risks to keep children safe.
- The childminder understands how to role model positive behaviour so that children learn to have respect and consideration for others.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

## What does the setting need to do to improve?

#### To meet the requirements of the early years foundation stage and Childcare Register the provider must:
