Summary of key findings

This provision meets requirements

- The childminder has a secure understanding of the learning and development requirements. She knows how to plan a curriculum and how to use it to assess and promote children's learning and development so they acquire the knowledge and skills they need for future learning. The childminder has a secure knowledge and understanding of how to help children to discover and develop their interests and talents. She explains how she provides activities related to what she knows children enjoy and to extend their interests further. For instance, if a child enjoys playing with musical instruments, the childminder would make musical instruments easily accessible, sing their favourite nursery rhymes and teach them to tap to rhythms.
- The childminder understands the importance of supervising children at all times in order to keep them safe in her home and on outings. For example, she makes sure that she stays close to them when they use paddling pools in her garden and in the local park.
- The childminder has a secure knowledge and understanding of how to provide children with a positive role model. She speaks to children and other people in a calm way, and is relaxed and at ease. The childminder explains that she helps children to find solutions to problems, treating them fairly and respectfully.
- The childminder has a secure knowledge of child protection procedures. Since registration, she has completed additional safeguarding training. This has enhanced her understanding of how to keep children safe.
- The childminder understands how to work with parents to promote children's good health, independence and to meet their individual care needs. She has a good knowledge and understanding of how to identify and assess children's progress from their starting points, and works with parents to build on what children can already do. For example, she supports children who are toilet training, helps children to hold a pen correctly, dress themselves independently and develop their confidence and social skills.
- The childminder knows how to encourage children to remember what they learn. She describes how she talks to them while they play, asks them questions and talks about what they have done each day.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
