Summary of key findings

This provision meets requirements

- The childminder understands her responsibility to safeguard children. She knows how to identify the indicators of abuse and the correct procedures to follow if she has any concerns about a child's welfare.
- The childminder understands how to use information gained from observations and assessment to identify children's learning needs and how to support their development further.
- The childminder demonstrates how she will share regular information with parents about the activities children take part in and their achievements during their time with her. She acknowledges the importance of working in close partnership with parents to support children's ongoing progress and continuity of care.
- The childminder knows how to promote children's positive behaviour. She understands the importance of teaching children to respect others and develop an understanding of what is expected of them.
- The childminder discussed how she carries out risk assessment procedures of the home and for outings to minimise risks and hazards. She is aware of the importance of providing a safe environment for children to play in.
- The childminder understands how to support children's health and emotional well-being. She plans to provide children with nutritious meals and regular opportunities to enjoy fresh air and exercise.
- The childminder discussed how she uses self-evaluation to reflect on her practice to help her to improve and develop her provision continually.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
