

Compliance action taken for childcare provision

Summary of outcome

All early years providers must meet the legal requirements in the 'Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage', which you can find at www.gov.uk/government/publications/early-years-foundation-stage-framework--2. If we find that a provider is not meeting the requirements, we can take action to ensure they put matters right. On 16 September 2019 we inspected the provider and judged them inadequate with enforcement. We served a Welfare Requirements Notice. This is a legal notice that requires the provider to take the actions below within the timescales set out. The provider will be able to give parents further information about this.

Actions needed:

make sure that the information requested is provided to Ofsted without delay, including evidence of a change of name, by 27 September 2019

ensure staff receive effective supervision and support to enable them to understand their roles and responsibilities, and help improve the quality of their teaching, by 11 October 2019

implement a secure key person system to aid children's individual needs and well-being, and build successful partnerships with parents, by 11 October 2019

make sure leaders gain a secure understanding of safeguarding, namely the procedures to follow if staff have caused harm to a child, and effectively implementing the policy for checks on new staff, by 11 October 2019

ensure all records are easily accessible and available for inspection, specifically children's two-year checks, by 11 October 2019

develop partnership working with other settings children attend to aid continuity of learning and care, by 11 October 2019

On 22 October 2019 we conducted an announced visit to the provider and found that they had taken sufficient action to meet the Welfare Requirements Notice.
