

Compliance action taken for childcare provision

Summary of outcome

Early years providers must meet the legal requirements in the Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage, (EYFS) which you can find at www.gov.uk/government/publications/early-years-foundation-stage-framework--2. If we find that a provider is not meeting the requirements, we can take action to ensure they put matters right.

At an inspection on 5 September 2019, we found that this provider was not meeting some of these requirements. We have served a Welfare Requirements Notice. This is a legal notice that required the provider to take the actions below within the timescales set out. The provider will be able to give parents further information about this.

Actions:

- ensure Ofsted is kept up to date with any changes made to the nominated individual, provider and the manager of the setting by 9 October 2019
- ensure all staff have an up-to-date knowledge of safeguarding issues so that they are fully aware of the correct action to take if they have any concerns about a child or another member of staff by 9 October 2019
- obtain prior written permission from parents to administer medication to a child by 9 October 2019
- ensure that staff keep a clear record of the dates and the dose of medication administered to a child by 9 October 2019
- keep a written record which includes the name of the person who obtained the vetting and disclosure and barring service checks for staff by 9 October 2019
- ensure that leaders and managers improve their knowledge of the early years and childcare register requirements by 9 October 2019.

On a monitoring visit on 10 October 2019, we found that the provider had satisfactorily met the actions within the timescale. She had updated the knowledge and understanding of safeguarding procedures for all staff, implemented revised medication policies and procedures, made accurate recordings of the details of vetting checks she makes, and



updated the knowledge of the registration requirements for herself and the other leaders in the setting. Additionally, the provider has made us aware of the correct details for the leadership and management team. We were satisfied with the actions the provider had taken to comply with the Welfare Requirements Notice. The provider is still registered with Ofsted.
