## Summary of key findings

### This provision meets requirements

- The childminder understands the learning and development needs of children. She plans to provide a broad curriculum of activities to help children meet their next steps in learning.
- The childminder understands the importance of working in partnership with parents. She plans to share children's progress with parents on a regular basis and consider parents' preferences regarding their children's care routines.
- The childminder is committed to continuous professional development. She has completed a degree in childcare and attends regular training to update her knowledge.
- The childminder knows how to identify when there may be safeguarding concerns about a child. She has a clear procedure to follow for reporting concerns should she feel a child is at risk of suffering harm.
- The childminder has ensured she has a range of toys and resources which are suitable for the age range of children she is registered to care for.
- The childminder understands the importance of ensuring children learn about the local community. She plans to take children to the library and local park regularly.
- The childminder understands the importance of keeping children safe. She plans to carry out ongoing risk assessments for all areas of her home and any activities involving children, including trips and outings.
- The childminder demonstrates an understanding of how to promote positive behaviour in children. She has clear behaviour management strategies in place which will be shared with parents.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
