Summary of key findings

This provision meets requirements

- The experienced childminder has worked with children for many years. Supporting children to kind, caring and respectful is a high priority. The childminder understands how to provide a warm and caring environment for children, and describes how she builds close emotional bonds with the children in her care.
- The childminder's safeguarding knowledge is secure. She is aware of the signs and symptoms of the different types of abuse and knows how to report a concern.
- The childminder is professional and well organised. She successfully implements a variety of records, policies and procedures to support her practice.
- The childminder's premises are safe and secure. She constantly risk assesses the areas children access and ensures that their safety is promoted.
- The childminder offers a range of suitable activities, indoors and outdoors, to sustain children's interest, including football, puzzles, construction toys and colouring.
- The childminder understands how to help children to lead a healthy lifestyle. Meals are freshly prepared each day. However, at times, treats offered to children could be healthier.
- The childminder recognises the importance of developing strong relationships with parents. For example, she gives parents surveys to complete, which she uses to support her self-evaluation.
- The childminder has an inclusive setting. She recognises the value of teaching children about the diverse world in which they live. The childminder explains how she helps children to develop positive relationships and to be tolerant, kind and respectful.
- The childminder understands how to manage children's behaviour. She recognises the need to teach children to be independent and to help them to develop their confidence and self-esteem.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
