## **Summary of key findings**

#### This provision does not meet requirements

- The childminder understands the learning and development requirements of the early years foundation stage. She has a wide range of resources available in her home to support children's learning. She updates and replaces toys, as required, to meet children's changing needs and interests.
- The childminder has systems in place to observe and monitor children's progress. She offers children a broad range of enjoyable activities in her home and in the local community to help to promote their ongoing development.
- The childminder understands how to identify and eliminate potential risks to children to promote their welfare and ensure they can play safely. She has a clear understanding of how to safeguard children and how to seek advice and support should she have a concern.
- The childminder recognises the value of working in partnership with parents to help ensure consistency in children's care and learning. She gathers useful information from them when children start at her setting, which supports children in settling swiftly.
- The childminder has high expectations regarding children's behaviour. She describes how she will manage their behaviour in a supportive way and build sharing, turn taking and an understanding of others into daily activities.
- The childminder has allowed her paediatric first-aid qualification to lapse. She has not renewed it to ensure she is compliant with requirements.
- The childminder understands how to evaluate her practice to identify ways of improving children's experiences. However, she does not access professional development opportunities to help enhance her knowledge and skills further.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
