Summary of key findings

This provision meets requirements

- The childminder is professional and well organised. He has detailed policies and procedures in place to ensure that children are kept safe and secure.
- The childminder offers a warm and welcoming learning environment. He has a wide range of resources and understands how these help to support children's learning across all areas.
- The childminder recognises the importance of working in partnership with parents. He understands the value of sharing information to support a consistent approach to children's care and learning.
- The childminder has procedures for helping new children to settle in. He recognises the importance of working closely with parents to obtain vital information before children start.
- The childminder knows how to promote children's health and well-being, and the importance of spending time outdoors, healthy eating and exercise.
- The childminder understands his responsibility to safeguard children. He knows how to identify the indicators of abuse and the correct procedures to follow if he has any concerns about a child's welfare. The childminder is aware of the importance of risk assessments and providing a safe environment for children.
- The childminder knows how to use positive strategies to manage children's behaviour, such as teaching children to respect others and to develop confidence in their own abilities.
- The childminder understands the importance of self-evaluation to identify and target areas for improvement and professional development. For example, he has attended courses to develop his knowledge of working with children with special educational needs and/or disabilities.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

- The inspector asked the childminder questions throughout the inspection to establish his understanding of how to safeguard children.
