Summary of key findings

This provision meets requirements

- The childminder understands how to reflect on her practice and identify areas for improvement. She then uses regular meetings with other childminders and her attendance at courses to improve her skills and knowledge.
- The childminder is aware of the procedure for referring information on to relevant professionals if she has a concern about a child's welfare. She has suitable procedures in place for safeguarding children.
- The childminder has plans in place for providing healthy snacks and meals for children. She talks about the outdoor activities she will provide. The childminder has a range of toys and equipment for children to use, both indoors and outdoors.
- The childminder understands the importance of completing observations to assess and monitor children's progress. She describes how she will provide a suitable range of learning experiences to help children make progress in their development. The childminder is fully aware of the importance of keeping parents informed about their children's ongoing development.
- The childminder identifies how to promote positive behaviour, including how to help children learn to value difference and develop respect for others.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
