Summary of key findings

This provision meets requirements

- Through discussion, the childminder demonstrates a good understanding of child protection procedures. She describes how she will report any safeguarding concerns and how she will identify children who may be at risk of being exposed to extreme views.
- The childminder verbally demonstrated an appropriate knowledge of how to monitor children's progress through observation and assessments. She maintains a suitable variety of toys and resources. She shows how she organises these appropriately so that they are accessible to children.
- The childminder describes how she will support children to learn about healthy lifestyles, including how to follow good hygiene routines. She talks about the importance daily exercise plays in supporting children's physical development.
- The childminder is proactive in keeping her knowledge current and up to date and talks about completing online research and training.
- The childminder describes how she will evaluate her practice to help improve the quality of the provision for children.
- The childminder showed an effective awareness of how to manage children's behaviour, to help them learn to share and consider the needs of others. She intends to help children to learn to respect and value others.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
