

Compliance action taken for childcare provision

Summary of outcome

had All early years providers must meet the legal requirements in the 'Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage', which you can find at

www.gov.uk/government/publications/early-years-foundation-stage-framework--2. If we find that a provider is not meeting the requirements, we can take action to ensure they put matters right.

On the 2 October 2019, we received concerns that the provider was not meeting some of the early years foundation stage requirements. On the 10 October 2019 we conducted an unannounced visit and served a Welfare Requirements Notice. This is a legal notice that requires the provider to take the actions below within the timescales set out.

Actions needed by 25 October 2019

improve the risk assessment of activities provided to children to identify and minimise risks, in particular those relating to children's allergies

ensure information gained from parents about children's allergies, health and dietary needs is accurately recorded and acted on, including sharing all relevant information with staff to enable them to meet children's needs.

We carried out an unannounced visit on 14 November 2019 to check the action taken by the provider to meet the Welfare Requirements Notice. The provider had reviewed and improved the risk assessment relating to children's allergies. We are satisfied with the action taken by the provider to meet the action raised.

The provider is still registered with Ofsted.

Publication of compliance action

We aim to ensure that the welfare of children and young people is protected in the services we regulate. The Childcare Act 2006 and accompanying regulations set out our responsibilities to regulate childminders and childcare providers. This includes the enforcement powers we have in relation to those registered providers who do not comply with the requirements for registration.

We publish details of any actions we take, or the childminder or childcare provider takes to bring about compliance with requirements on our website for a period of five years commencing on the date we complete our investigation.
