**Overall outcome**

### Main inspection findings

### Part 3. Welfare, health and safety of pupils

Paragraphs 7, 11, 12, 16, 32(1)(c)

- The school's approach to safeguarding its pupils continues to meet the requirements of the independent school standards. The school's policy reflects the latest statutory guidance issued by the Secretary of State and is published online. Staff at all levels are suitably trained, any concerns are raised quickly, and all referrals are thoroughly documented. Leaders have a strong understanding of the contextualised risks their pupils face. There is a culture of vigilance, and a shared commitment to keep pupils as safe from harm as possible.
- Leaders have suitably updated the school's health and safety and risk assessment policies in the light of the new premises. These policies are implemented well. The fire safety system, equipment, logs and checks are suitable and confirmed in the school's September 2019 risk assessment as compliant with the Regulatory Reform (Fire Safety) Order 2005. Leaders have carefully considered the potential risks presented at the new premises and taken appropriate action to minimise them.
- The independent school standards in this part are met.

#### Part 5. Premises of and accommodation at schools

#### All paragraphs

■ The school's new premises at 62–64 Western Road, Romford RM1 3LP have been fully modernised and refurbished. They are clean, safe, secure and well maintained. The premises include five classrooms, two workshops, a suitable medical room, separate toilet, washing, shower and changing facilities for pupils, labelled drinking water supplies and a suitable outdoor garden space for recreation. Physical education is taught off-site at local leisure facilities. The standards relating to indoor and outdoor lighting, hot water supplies, acoustics and health and safety are all met.
