

Compliance action taken for childcare provision

Summary of outcome

All early years providers must meet the legal requirements in the 'Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage', which you can find at www.gov.uk/government/publications/early-years-foundation-stage-framework--2. If we find that a provider is not meeting the requirements, we can take action to ensure they put matters right. On 8 October 2019, we carried out an inspection that resulted in an inadequate with enforcement judgment, as the provider was not meeting some of these requirements. We have served a welfare requirements notice. This is a legal notice that requires the provider to take the actions detailed in the inspection report by 20 November 2019. The provider will be able to give parents further information about this.

We visited the provider on the 21 November 2019 to check their compliance with the welfare requirement notices that were set at their inspection on the 8 October 2019.

At the monitoring visit, we found that the provider had met some of the actions included in the notice. The provider has been unable to meet one of the actions due to the limitations of available and suitable courses. We have issued a new welfare requirements notice to allow them to meet this requirement by the 13 December

- ensure the designated safeguarding lead attends an appropriate child protection

- course that meets the local safeguarding child board requirements.

The provider remains registered with Ofsted.

Publication of compliance action

We aim to ensure that the welfare of children and young people is protected in the services we regulate. The Childcare Act 2006 and accompanying regulations set out our responsibilities to regulate childminders and childcare providers. This includes the enforcement powers we have in relation to those registered providers who do not comply with the requirements for registration.

We publish details of any actions we take, or the childminder or childcare provider takes to bring about compliance with requirements on our website for a period of five years commencing on the date we complete our investigation.
