# **Summary of key findings**

#### This provision meets requirements

- The childminder has attended first-aid and safeguarding training to ensure that she stays up to date. She understands her responsibility to meet children's needs, protect them from harm and keep them safe. She explains how she encourages children to learn to keep themselves safe, for example, in regard to road safety and stranger danger.
- The childminder has a suitable knowledge of the learning and development requirements of the early years foundation stage. She attended training to develop her knowledge of how to observe children's play and assess their progress. She knows how to provide enjoyable learning experiences, in the home and in the local community, based on children's interests and abilities.
- The childminder understands the importance of working in partnership with parents or other professionals involved in children's care. She confirms that she intends to obtain information from parents when children first start to ensure that she can meet their individual care and learning needs.
- The childminder shows how she plans to use her knowledge of nutrition to provide a range of meals and snacks that promote children's good health. She explains how she intends to encourage children to be active and understand the benefits of an active lifestyle.
- The childminder understands how to help children to learn the difference between right and wrong. She shows how she intends to help children to learn to respect others and encourage positive behaviours.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
