Summary of key findings

This provision does not meet requirements

- The childminder has not maintained her knowledge of the learning and development requirements. She is not aware of the summary progress report for children aged between two and three years. She has failed to demonstrate how she intends to plan suitably challenging activities to help children to make progress in all areas of learning.
- The childminder has not kept her knowledge about safeguarding up to date. For example, she lacks awareness of the indicators that a child may be at risk of being drawn into extreme behaviours or views. However, she knows about the reporting procedures to follow if she has any welfare concerns.
- The childminder does not evaluate her provision to help identify weaknesses in her practice.
- The childminder intends to share information with parents, for example to help manage children's behaviour.
- The childminder aims to form relationships with children to support their emotional and personal development.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

What does the setting need to do to improve?

To meet the requirements of the early years foundation stage and Childcare Register the provider must:
