

## Compliance action taken for childcare provision

## Summary of outcome

All early years providers must meet the legal requirements in the 'Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage', which you can find at <u>www.gov.uk/government/publications/early-years-foundation-stage-framework--2</u>. If we find that a provider is not meeting the requirements, we can take action to ensure they put matters right. On 5 November 2019 we inspected the provider and found they were not meeting some of these requirements. We served a Welfare Requirements Notice. This is a legal notice that requires the provider to take the actions below within the timescales set out. The provider will be able to give parents further information about this. The provider is still registered with Ofsted.

Actions needed:

ensure all staff understand the safeguarding policy and procedure and have an up-to-date knowledge of safeguarding issues so that they can identify and respond to signs of possible abuse at the earliest opportunity by 27 November 2019

ensure that the lead practitioner knows how to identity, understand and respond appropriately to signs of possible abuse and neglect by 27 November 2019

ensure all staff develop a secure knowledge and understanding of the 'Prevent duty guidance for England and Wales 2015' in order to identify children who may be at risk of being exposed to extreme behaviours or views by 27 November 2019

implement arrangements to enable a regular two-way flow of information between parents and providers, when a child attends more than one setting, to ensure children's development and welfare needs are consistently promoted by 27 November 2019



implement effective procedures to promote the good health of the children attending the setting, to prevent the spread of infection by 27 November 2019

consider children's stages of development in order to plan challenging and purposeful activities by 27 November 2019

strengthen the quality of staff interactions with children, so that they make the best of every learning opportunity, to extend and challenge children's learning by 27 November 2019

On 28 November 2019 we completed a visit to the provider. We found they had taken the necessary steps to meet the actions set out within the welfare requirements notice.
