## Summary of key findings

### This provision meets requirements

- The provider demonstrates a good understanding of the signs and symptoms of abuse. She knows where to report any concerns she has about children's safety and welfare. The provider ensures that staff's knowledge of child protection is up to date.
- The provider explains how she will work in partnership with schools that children also attend. She intends to build further on the skills children learn at school.
- The provider shows an understanding of how to promote children's good health. She plans to gather information from parents about children's dietary and medical requirements to help staff promote further. She intends to offer children healthy snacks and opportunities for daily fresh air and exercise.
- The provider demonstrates a suitable understanding of how to manage children's behaviour. For example, she explains how she will share rules and boundaries with children, such as to be kind to everyone. She intends to promote the use of good manners and will provide activities that encourage children to share and take turns. Older children demonstrate their understanding of how they can keep themselves safe. They say that they need to wear, 'high-visibility vests to keep safe' when they play outdoors.
- The provider intends to use a variety of ways to communicate with parents. For example, she plans to ask them about their children's interests when they first start. She explains how this will help staff to plan activities that they know children will enjoy. The provider explains how she will encourage staff to speak to parents daily when they drop off and collect their children and to pass on messages from school.
- The provider intends to gather feedback from parents and children to help her evaluate the provision.
- The provider has systems in place to promote children's safety and welfare. For example, to ensure that risk assessments of the premises are carried out each day and that the building is kept secure. This will help to promote children's safety.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Little Lockets Kids Club registered in 2017 and is situated in Heckington. The club employs three members of childcare staff. Of these, one holds an appropriate early years qualification at level 6, one at level 3 and one at level 2. The club opens from Monday to Friday during term time only. Sessions are from 7.30am until 9am and from 3.20pm until 6pm.

- The inspector discussed with the provider how she intends to meet the safeguarding and welfare requirements.

- The inspector had a tour of the premises used by children and discussed the equipment and toys available.
- The inspector spoke to older children about their experiences at the club.
