This children's home is owned and managed by a private organisation. It is registered for up to five children aged between 11 and 17 years who have had adverse childhood experiences that have led to associated trauma and presenting complex behaviours.

The manager registered with Ofsted to manage this home in June 2017.

The effectiveness of the home and the progress and experiences of children and young people since the most recent full inspection

This home was judged good at the last full inspection. At the interim inspection, Ofsted judges that it has improved effectiveness.

Moves into and from the home are managed well. The child who recently moved in shared with the inspector that they are very happy and like the adults in the home. A school placement has already been identified for the child and the headmaster was at the home to meet the child during this inspection. The manager was a strong advocate for the child and frequently met with education professionals to ensure the best possible outcome on behalf of the child.

Staff help children well to prepare for adulthood. The manager and staff have supported one child to access a personalised, local authority-funded college placement of his choice. The child has consistently attended and there is close monitoring and support of this provision. In addition, staff have assisted the child to gain part-time employment.

Staff ensure children have positive experiences in this home. Children have had individual holidays to requested locations including Snowdonia National Park zip wiring and trampolining in caves, as well as a holiday to Cornwall. Staff ensure that children participate in different hobbies including scouts, attending the gym and youth club. Consequently, children develop their social skills and sense of well-being.

Complaints are managed well. There has been one complaint made since the last inspection and a concern raised about staff practice in the home. The manager ensured that robust action was taken and ensured that all parties were consulted to rectify the matter to the highest standard. Investigations are exceptionally thorough with disciplinary procedures followed properly. The manager has provided strong oversight through staff supervision.
