Summary of key findings

This provision meets requirements

- Since the last inspection, the childminder has improved her knowledge and understanding of safeguarding. She describes how she will keep children safe and protected from harm. The childminder recognises risk factors for young children and describes how she will refer any concerns that she might have about their welfare. She has recently undertaken training and shares her understanding of wider safeguarding issues.
- The childminder describes how she will implement the learning and development requirements of the early years foundation stage. She shares that she will plan activities geared towards individual children's interests and stages of learning. She has processes in place to monitor and assess children to support them to make progress.
- Through discussion, the childminder demonstrates her understanding of developing close emotional relationships with children she cares for. Starting with a gradual settling-in process, she explains how she hopes children will grow in confidence and become successful learners from this secure basis.
- The childminder talks about how she will reflect on her practice and take into account the views of those who use her service to identify and make improvements. She plans to take children to playgroups to provide opportunities for them to meet with others, make friends and develop important social skills.
- Through discussion, the childminder shows she is aware of the importance of teaching children about healthy lifestyles, such as eating a balanced diet and playing outside in the fresh air.
- There is a clear policy in place to promote positive behaviour. The childminder talks about the importance of developing trusting relationships with children and helping them to feel safe and secure.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- The inspector discussed the policies and procedures with the childminder and viewed documentation that she will use when caring for children.
- The inspector had a tour of the areas of the premises used by children and discussed the equipment and toys available.
- The inspector discussed the safeguarding and welfare requirements with the childminder and took into consideration the suitability checks.

The registered person must ensure that this provision complies with the statutory framework for children's learning, development and care, known as the early years foundation stage.



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
