Summary of key findings

This provision meets requirements

- The manager, who is also the nominated individual, is very reflective and has a strong vision for the setting. She can clearly explain how children are central to their vision and how she will provide them with the experiences to help them to progress. The manager articulates the importance of ensuring children's emotional well-being is promoted. She intends to implement appropriate strategies to help children to manage their behaviours.
- The manager intends to provide opportunities for staff to take up training to increase their knowledge and skills. She has methods for coaching to support individual staff to develop their personal effectiveness.
- The manager has a clear understanding of child development and how learning will be promoted. She has plans for routine observation to inform regular assessments of children's learning. The manager intends to use this information to plan for what children need to learn next.
- The manager has arrangements for partnership working with parents. She intends to share information about children's learning with parents so that they are kept fully up to date with what children know and can do.
- The manager intends to work closely with other professionals that may be involved with children and families. She has mechanisms in place to work closely with the on-site school to ensure that transitions are smooth and successful.
- The manager demonstrates, through discussions, a strong understanding of the possible signs and symptoms of abuse and the reporting procedures to follow if concerns arise. She is clear about other agencies that she needs to contact where there are concerns about adults working with children. The manager shows an ability to risk assess the environment effectively to ensure that children are safe. There is a range of documentation, policies and procedures in place to ensure the welfare of children is promoted.
- The learning environment, both indoors and outdoors, is spacious, well maintained, safe and secure. The manager explains that the range of resources that will be provided to children will give them the opportunities to develop their skills in readiness for school.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Jelly Bean's Nature Nursery Ltd registered in 2017. The nursery employs four members of childcare staff. The manager holds qualified teacher status and three childcare staff hold appropriate early years qualifications at level 2 and above. The nursery operates during term time only from 12pm to 3pm, Monday to Friday. It provides funded early education for two-, three- and four-year-old children.
