### Summary of key findings for parents

#### This provision meets requirements

- The childminder explains her understanding of how to manage children's behaviour positively. She knows how to teach children to show respect and tolerance for each other.
- The childminder has a secure understanding of her responsibility to protect children. Training is kept up to date with current guidance and legislation and she knows how and where to report any concerns.
- The childminder demonstrates that she is aware that self-evaluation contributes towards improving outcomes for children. She describes how she will continue to identify her strengths and areas she can improve.
- The childminder understands to how keep children safe at all times. She comprehensively assesses risks in her environment and outdoors to make sure that children can play and learn in safety.
- The childminder understands the importance of working in close partnerships with parents. She demonstrates an understanding of how to offer an inclusive service, and intends to provide parents with regular feedback about their child's care and learning.
- The childminder demonstrates her understanding of the learning and development requirements. She explains how she intends to plan activities to support children in their learning and development.
- The childminder knows how to help children develop their independence, such as self-care skills, to prepare them for the next stages of their learning.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
