

Compliance action taken for childcare provision

Summary of outcome

All early years providers must meet the legal requirements in the [Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage](#). If we find that a provider is not meeting the requirements, we can take action to ensure they put matters right. On 4 March 2019, we inspected the provider and found that the provider was not meeting some of these requirements. We sent the provider a notice to improve which asked the provider to take action. The provider will be able to give parents further information about this.

Actions required

- ensure that the correct adult-to-child ratios are maintained at all times by 1 April 2019
- keep an accurate daily record of children's attendance to ensure their safety at all times by 18 March 2019
- take all reasonable steps to ensure that children are not exposed to risks, with specific regard to supervising children on the open staircase by 18 March 2019
- develop an understanding of how to identify and protect children at risk from extreme views and behaviours by 1 April 2019
- establish a secure understanding of how to safely store data so that children and the information held about them are protected by 1 April 2019
- promote children's good health and hygiene at every opportunity so that good hygiene practice is embedded in children's understanding of what contributes to a healthy lifestyle by 18 March 2019
- develop systems to share accurate information with parents from the start about each child's stage of development in order to fully support continuity of children's learning by 15 April 2019
- introduce an observation and assessment system to monitor children's level of achievement, including the progress check at age two, and use this information to tailor activities to meet children's individual learning needs by 15 April 2019
- develop knowledge and understanding of the learning and development requirements,

specifically the prime and specific areas of learning by 15 April 2019

Due to a lack of contact from the provider, Ofsted were unable to complete the re-inspection within the required timeframe. We therefore took steps to cancel the provider's registration. The provider objected to us taking this step. Having heard the provider's reasons for objecting to this step, we have decided not to proceed with cancellation and the provider remains registered with Ofsted.

The next step will be a full inspection

Publication of compliance action

We aim to ensure that the welfare of children and young people is protected in the services we regulate. The Childcare Act 2006 and accompanying regulations set out our responsibilities to regulate childminders and childcare providers. This includes the enforcement powers we have in relation to those registered providers who do not comply with the requirements for registration.

We publish details of any actions we take, or the childminder or childcare provider takes to bring about compliance with requirements on our website for a period of five years commencing on the date we complete our investigation.
