Summary of key findings

This provision does not meet requirements

- The childminder does not meet all of the legal requirements of the early years foundation stage. She has not maintained her paediatric first-aid certificate. She does not carry public liability insurance. The childminder has not notified Ofsted of significant changes to her working hours, which is a requirement.
- The childminder provides a welcoming environment for children. She conducts daily checks and risk assessments to assess and minimise risks to children. She provides a wide range of resources and activities which are appropriate for children's ages and stages of development.
- The childminder has a sound understanding of child protection issues. She has a clear policy and procedure in place to follow should she have any cause for concern about a child in her care.
- The childminder recognises the importance of maintaining close partnerships with parents and other professionals. She understands the value of sharing information to support a consistent approach to children's care and learning.
- The childminder understands how to manage children's behaviour. She recognises the need to teach children to be independent and to help them to develop their confidence and self-esteem. She explains how she helps children to develop positive relationships and to be tolerant, kind and respectful.
- The childminder demonstrates a good understanding of how to support children's learning and development. She understands how to observe and assess children's progress. She describes how she will plan activities and offer support to promote the next steps in learning for children who are at different stages of their development. The childminder knows how to support parents in developing their children's learning at home.
- The childminder understands the importance of ensuring that children receive a healthy diet and regular exercise to promote their well-being. She describes how she plans to use her outdoor play area to help children to develop their physical skills.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

What does the setting need to do to improve?
