Summary of key findings

This provision meets requirements

- The childminder recognises the value of working in partnership with parents and other professionals to help ensure consistency in children's care and learning.
- The childminder describes how she will provide a broad curriculum and use her observations to identify the next steps for children's learning.
- The childminder explains how she will promote healthy lifestyles and care practices. She will provide children with opportunities to learn to manage their personal care. They will have regular opportunities to be active outside in the fresh air.
- The childminder explains how she will promote children's independence. She describes how she will help children learn to take turns with toys and behave kindly towards each other.
- The childminder knows how to evaluate her practice. She seeks the views of parents and children to develop the provision.
- The childminder's premises are suitable for the education and care of children, and she demonstrates a good knowledge of requirements and how children learn.
- The childminder understands the importance of providing a healthy diet and promoting healthy lifestyles. She explains how she will encourage children to manage their personal care.
- The childminder understands the procedures to report any concerns or allegations to the relevant authorities. She has a clear understanding of her role and responsibilities to safeguard children.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
