## Summary of key findings

### This provision meets requirements

- The childminder has a good understanding of the early years foundation stage. She is aware of how to provide activities and experiences for children of different ages, to promote their learning further.
- The childminder has a secure understanding of the importance of monitoring children's progress and planning for their next steps in learning.
- The childminder understands the importance of working in partnership with other professionals, to support children and their families. She has a secure knowledge of how to work with parents to involve them in their children's learning.
- The childminder recognises the need to keep her professional development up to date, so that she is aware of changes to local procedures and legislation.
- The childminder has a good understanding of safeguarding and child protection matters. She is fully aware of the procedures to follow, if she has concerns about the welfare of a children.
- The childminder recognises the importance of promoting healthy lifestyles for children. For example, through encouraging regular fresh air and exercise and by providing healthy and nutritious meals.
- The childminder is aware of how to manage children's behaviour, such as through being consistent and by having clear boundaries in place.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

### Inspection activities

- The inspector checked the childminder's understanding of safeguarding and child protection matters.
