Summary of key findings

This provision meets requirements

- The childminder knows the procedures to follow in order to safeguard children. She demonstrates a clear understanding of the signs and symptoms that may indicate a child is at risk.
- The childminder recognises her role in teaching children to respect and value others. She understands the importance of setting clear boundaries, to help guide children's behaviour.
- The childminder has a good understanding of the learning and development requirements. She knows the significance of providing a curriculum that is designed to give all children the knowledge and skills they need to succeed in life. The childminder acknowledges the importance of assessing children's progress, to help quickly identify any gaps in their development.
- The childminder recognises the importance of providing children with healthy balanced meals and opportunities for physical activities.
- The childminder acknowledges the importance of working in partnerships with parents and other professionals involved in children's care, to help provide continuity in children's learning.
- The childminder is committed to her ongoing professional development. She regularly completes online training to help strengthen her knowledge and skills. She knows how to evaluate her practice and seeks the views of parents and children, to help identify areas for improvement.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children.
