## Summary of key findings

### This provision meets requirements

- The childminder understands how to reflect on the quality of her practice and recognises the need to continue to improve her skills and knowledge.
- The childminder successfully implements a variety of policies and procedures to support her practice and shares these with parents. She has a clear understanding of how to seek advice and support should she have a concern. Daily risk assessments help to reduce hazards and enable the childminder to promote children's safety and welfare effectively.
- The childminder explains how she plans a broad curriculum and uses her observations of children to identify what they know and can do. She has a wide range of resources available in her home to support children's learning.
- The childminder demonstrates how she promotes healthy lifestyles. She explains how she provides children with balanced meals and regular opportunities to be active and play outside in the fresh air.
- The childminder recognises the importance of strong partnerships with parents and professionals at other settings that children attend. She knows that this helps ensure consistency in children's care and learning.
- The childminder has high expectations regarding children's behaviour. She recognises the importance of supporting children to develop their confidence and self-esteem. The childminder knows how to teach children how to manage their feelings, and to help them develop positive attitudes to learning.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
