## Summary of key findings

#### This provision meets requirements

- The childminder understands the importance of getting to know children and building strong relationships with them. She knows how to teach children about behaviour expectations, to help them learn how to share, take turns and play cooperatively with each other.
- The childminder understands her responsibility to promote children's well-being. She has suitable risk assessment procedures to help her identify and reduce any hazards to the children. She has public liability insurance in place and she holds a first-aid certificate, to ensure that she can manage any minor accidents that may occur.
- The childminder has a range of policies to support her practice. She knows the procedures to follow if she has any concerns about children's welfare and she has refreshed her knowledge of child protection through training.
- The childminder knows how to encourage children's health and hygiene and develop children's physical skills. She discusses offering children lots of opportunities to be outside and enjoy being active in the fresh air, such as playing in her garden and on visits to local parks.
- The childminder understands how to plan activities to meet children's needs, to help them make progress and gain the skills they need for the future. She recognises the importance of working in partnership with parents, to help provide a consistent approach to supporting children's development and care needs.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
