

Compliance action taken for childcare provision

Summary of outcome

All early years providers must meet the legal requirements in the Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage. If we find that a provider is not meeting the requirements, we can take action to ensure they put matters right. On 20 September 2019, we received concerns that this provider was not meeting some of these requirements. We served a welfare requirements notice. This is a legal notice that requires the provider to take the actions below within the timescales set out. The provider will be able to give parents further information about this.

- ensure all staff receive appropriate training to have an up-to-date knowledge of safeguarding issues so that they can respond in a timely and appropriate manner to any allegations of abuse made about staff to be completed by 16 January 2020
- ensure any allegations of abuse made about staff are referred to the designated officer with safeguarding responsibility within the local authority without delay to be completed by 16 January 2020
- ensure children's behaviour is managed in an appropriate way and in line with your behaviour management policy to be completed by 16 January 2020
- implement robust systems to ensure the accurate and timely completion of records maintained of children's attendance to be completed by 16 January 2020

On 17 February 2020 we visited the nursery and found the provider had complied with the welfare requirements notice. The provider meets the legal requirements in the Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage. The provider is still registered with Ofsted.

Publication of compliance action

We aim to ensure that the welfare of children and young people is protected in the services we regulate. The Childcare Act 2006 and accompanying regulations set out our responsibilities to regulate childminders and childcare providers. This includes the enforcement powers we have in relation to those registered providers who do not comply with the requirements for registration.

We publish details of any actions we take, or the childminder or childcare provider takes to

bring about compliance with requirements on our website for a period of five years commencing on the date we complete our investigation.
