## **Summary of key findings**

#### This provision does not meet requirements

- The childminder has failed to provide Ofsted with the required information, in order for suitability checks to be undertaken. This includes an enhanced Disclosure and Barring Service check for every person aged 16 or over living on the premises.
- The childminder has a current knowledge of safeguarding matters. She knows the procedures to follow if she has any concerns about children's welfare. She has public liability insurance and she holds a first-aid certificate to ensure that she can manage any minor accidents that may occur. She understands how to assess and minimise risks in her home and outings to help keep children safe.
- The childminder understands how to encourage a healthy lifestyle and support children's physical development. She plans to provide children with healthy snacks and regular opportunities to be outside, including playing in her garden and exploring equipment at local parks.
- The childminder knows the importance of building strong relationships with children. She discusses encouraging their good behaviour, providing clear boundaries and explanations, so children know what is expected of them.
- The childminder understands how children learn. She has plans for setting out her home with toys and resources that engage children's interest and provide challenge for them. She discusses using observations of children as they play to help her plan activities that support them to learn and make progress. She understands the importance of working in partnership with parents to provide a consistent approach for children's care and learning.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
