The effectiveness of the home and the progress and experiences of children and young people since the most recent full inspection

This home was judged good at the last full inspection. At the interim inspection, Ofsted judges that it has improved effectiveness.

Since the previous inspection, two children have moved into the home. Children receive a warm welcome because of the manager's meticulous planning and dedication. One child shared with the inspector that they 'absolutely love' living at this home because, the child said, one staff member has helped to 'turn my life around'.

Since the previous inspection, children have made progress from their starting points because of the consistent and nurturing responses of staff. For example, one child has reduced his aggressive behaviours, has improved his personal care and is more socially and emotionally confident.

The manager and staff place children's wishes and feelings at the heart of their work. Children's views are captured daily, as well as in monthly group and individual meetings. For example, one child who was unhappy about the food shopping has taken responsibility for the orders. This is helping to develop their independence and ensures that a variety of tastes are provided for.

The manager is focused on praising children's achievements and activities to promote progress. Photographs and messages of encouragement help children to remember these events and to improve their relationships with staff.

Complaints are managed to a high standard. Two complaints have been made since the last inspection, from the same child about another child living in the home. The manager has provided a thorough response within the organisation's policy timescales. The manager has spent time talking with each child to demonstrate understanding and tolerance, to fully resolve the issue.
