Information about this children's home

This home is owned by a private company. Its statement of purpose specifies that it will provide care and accommodation for up to two children aged from eight to 18 who have emotional and/or behavioural difficulties.

There has been no registered manager at the home since 30 June 2019.

The effectiveness of the home and the progress and experiences of children and young people since the most recent full inspection

This home was judged inadequate at the last full inspection. At this interim inspection the home was 'not judged'.

There were no children living at the home at the time of this inspection. A new manager was appointed in October 2019. He has applied to register with Ofsted and was present during part of this inspection. The service development officer for Benecare was present throughout this inspection.

A new deputy manager was employed but she resigned after one month. Recruitment is underway for a deputy home manager and residential care staff. Staff employed to work at this home are currently deployed elsewhere in the organisation. Some staff are subject to risk assessments. Their practice is being monitored through observations of their work in other homes. The manager meets with the core staff twice weekly. He is establishing a team culture through coaching and mentoring. The staff also complete routine checks and maintain the house.

Training has focused on lessons learned and how to develop positive relationships between staff and children. Reflective accounts following training show that staff have mostly made progress. However, concerns continue for some staff as their reflective accounts demonstrate that their punitive views continue. As a result, the current team requires some further work to ensure that its members can demonstrate they understand and can put into practice a positive ethos.

The statement of purpose continues to contain some overtly disciplinary language, in particular around sanctions. The safeguarding policy also lacks the quality and focus of the recently updated gross misconduct policy. As a result, these documents do not reflect the positive ways of working that the new manager and service development manager say they want to model.

A new independent visitor has been visiting the home. The reports are detailed, and the new manager is finding them useful. However, actions are not always completed in a timely way. A requirement from the previous inspection regarding the regulation 45 report has not yet been met. Neither the provider nor the independent visitor were sure of the date to submit this document, despite it being clearly stated on the previous report.

The home has been redecorated and is well maintained. Development plans include new furniture and further staff training. The manager identifies that he has some more work to do to further understand the compliance history of this home. Currently, the development plans focus on staff training and recruitment in order to prepare the home to accept children.
